1 (B) The City encourages all public agencies to facilitate the access of
2 immigrants and their families to basic services, including but not limited to legal
3 driver's licenses, health care, and education, including Albuquerque Technical
4 Vocational Institute and the University of New Mexico, to the fullest extent
5 allowable by law.

6 (C) The City will include in its legislative agenda requests that Congress
7 enact just and humane immigration reforms that provide immigrants and their
8 families with rights in this country that are commensurate with human dignity
9 and their status as taxpayers and contributing members of our community, and
10 that the State of New Mexico Legislature revise its laws and policies for health
11 care, education, and drivers' licenses to such that immigrants and their families
12 will have fair access to those services and privileges.

13 (D) The City shall not discriminate on the basis of a person's national origin
14 and will treat all persons with respect and dignity, regardless of immigration
15 status. The Human Rights Commission shall oversee the implementation of this
16 policy.

17 (E) No municipal resources shall be used to identify individuals' immigration
18 status or apprehend persons on the sole basis of immigration status, unless
19 otherwise required by law to do so.

20 SECTION 3: Each City department shall develop operational procedures
21 consistent with the policies set out in this Resolution.

22 SECTION 4: An Immigrant Resource Program is established, to provide
23 information and referral in the areas of English as a Second Language education,
24 citizenship classes, housing, health care, secondary vocational and higher
25 education and other areas. The Administration will recommend to the Council
26 whether this program should be administered by a City department or by
27 contract.


28 SECTION 5: The amount of \$50,000 is appropriated to the Department of

30 General Fund for the remainder of FY 2001 for the Immigrant Resource
31 Program.




